I participated in the ARRL SSB Sweepstakes contest this November and was able to work 83 of the 85 ARRL and RAC (Canadian) sections. I only missed getting Saskatchewan and Eastern Washington. I worked 21.5 of the 24 hours allowed over the weekend and made 474 QSOs.

The ARRL Sweepstakes contest began in 1930 and is one of the longest-running Amateur Radio contests. It is divided into two events, one for CW and one for SSB. The contest is further divided into subcategories. I operate in the "Single Operator, Low Power, Unassisted" category, which means that I cannot run more than 100 watts and I am not allowed to use spotting assistance. During the contest I was able to work both of the Montana Super Stations: Pat N9RV in Bonner and Levi K6JO operating KM7W in Shawmut. Both stations are in the running to win first place nationally in the Single Operator High Power category. They finished #1 and #2, respectively last year in the CW Sweepstakes. I also had the pleasure of a brief chat with N7MZW in Wyoming, who was a good friend of Ed-W7MAD. (See

We use a program that supports the now defunct AccuWeather interface, and an interface to Wunderground.



So, I have switched it over to use my personal weather station in East Helena through Wunderground. Unfortunately, this interface only reports the temperature, not the current weather conditions (clear and sunny, blizzard, etc.). So you'll need to look outside to see what the current conditions are!


